SUBJECT: National Fitness Campaign – Fitness Court Grant Opportunity

FACTS: Attached are three (3) documents with information about the National Fitness Campaign's (NFC) Fitness Court Grant opportunity.

The NFC has received funding from Priority Health to assist with installing their Fitness Courts throughout Michigan. There are currently 15 grants, from \$30,000-\$50,000, available to communities in Michigan.

The Fitness Court's are approximately 38-feet x 38-feet with seven (7) workout stations (page 7 of NFC Fitness Court Presentation). The participants can download a workout app to their phone from NFC for suggested workouts at no cost.

The Fitness Court compliments some of the improvements that the Parks Commission has identified for the Sports Park, i.e., walking path around perimeter, repurpose Field #1, etc...

These grants are a first come first serve, with a relatively streamlined application process. The grant review process takes approximately two-weeks from submittal of the application.

If there is interest in pursuing this grant, the City match would be \$150,000-\$175,000 to have a fitness court installed.

I will give a short presentation to the Commission on the NFC Grant program at the meeting.

Problem

Nationwide Obesity

New CDC data shows the prevalence of obesity shot up across all states in 2022 with every state and territory now having obesity levels over 20%. Twenty-two states recorded more than 35% of their populations are obese, up from 0 states a decade ago. 





Directly behind City Hall in Grand Blanc, MI sits a new Priority Health Fitness Court[®] at Dennis S. Smith Park. This Priority Health Fitness Court[®] launched with an exciting communityfocused event on June 14th featuring Mayor Soderstrom, City Council Representatives along with Police and Fire Department leadership.

Dennis S. Smith Park holds a special place in the community's heart, named in honor of the city's first Fire Chief. Additional projects within the park include a playground for children to coincide with the Fitness Court[®] for adults.

Andrea Croft "The Landscape that Makes Us"



SUBJECT: Memorial Park Gazebo – Mayor Plaques

FACTS: The gazebo in Memorial Park has plaques inside the gazebo of former mayors for the City of DeWitt that are now deceased. The plaques contain the name, birth date and death date.

The current policy calls for plaques to be installed in honor of a mayor once they are deceased. There has been a request to have the Parks Commission consider revising the policy to have plaques installed with the mayor's name during their term of office and left in the gazebo in perpetuity.
